Explanation Batch – Number Use by date

Batch-Number

Batch numbers allow a product to be uniquely assigned to a clearly defined process following delivery to the customer. This is very important for traceability, e.g. in the event of defects. The batch number is printed on various documents, such as the delivery note, invoice, and label.

Batch number structure/ 17 places

Batch-Number, example 112001529-02-01-1

11 = Ordinal number/ internal

20 = Year

01529 = Consecutive number

(Reset at the turn of the year)

= Separator

02 = Call-off number

= Separator

01 = Ordinal number/ internal

- = Separator

1 = Ordinal number/ internal

The "Use by" date is printed on the label.

A storage beyond the indicated period means not necessarily that the commodity is useless. An examination of the characteristics necessary for the respective targeted application is however in this case for reasons of the quality assurance essential.
